Seniors aged 80+ ski free. Tickets must be ordered at trip sign-up and will be purchased from TSV prior to Blazer departure. Military (active duty, reserve, retired, veterans) and Emergency Service Personnel (Police, Fire, EMT) must show valid ID to receive discount. One-day break allowed on multi-day tickets.

Ski Experience: New high-capacity snowmaking equipment on all beginner and intermediate slopes (49% of terrain) enables TSV to open its season earlier and stay open, and new high-speed quad Lift #1 moves skiers from the base up the mountain in 5 minutes.

Lodging: Three-night stay (double occupancy) at El Pueblo Lodge in Taos includes: wine and cheese welcome reception Friday evening, social gathering on heated terrace Saturday evening with green chili stew and generous hors d'oeuvres, full hot breakfast daily 6:30-9:30 AM, complementary cookies and chips n' salsa all day, fitness center, large outdoor hot tub, and one-mile walk to restaurants, shopping and historical sites in and around the Taos Plaza

Transportation in Taos: Provided daily to and from Taos Ski Valley on board our own coach or via Taos shuttle bus (Green Line) that stops in front of El Pueblo Lodge; other transportation can be arranged

Non-ski activities: Group reservations made for Sunday evening dinner at Lambert's of Taos, Gorge Grill, Taos Mesa Brewing Company and one more restaurant (to be announced). Planning continues for other activities such as a Taos walking tour, artisan tour, highlights tour, Ojo Caliente spa and mineral springs, or other adventures.



On October 17, the Blazers met at the Ski Shop. For a very informative evening. The Ski Shop Owner, Rick, spoke about the latest innovations in ski and board gear. To summarize in one word, **LIGHTER**.

Ski boots have better traction, are lighter and there is more customization. Skis are lighter, but still preform will with no chatter when going at high speeds. When you hold the skis up to a light, you can see that the core near the tips are built with a honeycomb material which reduces weight. Helmet technology is also lighter, yet safety values have increased with a two-piece construction. Clothing is also lighter with a lot more hollow-fill fiber, not to mention waterproof and windproof.
